With the LZR 588 BT, Magnat has brought out a wireless version of the entry-level over-ears LZR 580. While the LZR 580 is available in colorful looks like white/orange or turquoise/purple, the LZR 588 BT comes in classic black. Only the second combination of silver and orange takes up the vivacious style of the predecessor. The manufacturer has left the basic shape of the ear cups and headband unchanged and the same is true for the pleasant touch of the napped synthetic skin.

In terms of stability, however, the LZR 580 appears to be somewhat more rigid and therefore a bit more high quality than the wireless version. This affects the fit and wear comfort inasmuch as the LZR 588 BT feels a bit lighter on the head. All in all, however, the headset fits securely and can also be worn for a longer period of time without any problem thanks to the soft leatherette ear pads.

The first thing to mention regarding the range of features is, of course, the Bluetooth connectivity. The hands-free microphone and the easy-touch music controls are located directly on the headset. A jack cable is also provided so that you can continue listening when the headset runs out of juice after 19 hours.

In terms of sound, the tight bass sound is noticeable as with its predecessor, providing for warm acoustics in combination with the lush mid-range tones. This results, however, in the listener not perceiving the clarity and airiness in the treble range, which is sometimes particularly missed in bright, melodic sounding pieces of music. This will hardly upset the target group - though hi-fi fans should be aware of this.
